Have your fill of nature while participating in a wide variety of exciting activities, including hiking, trekking, mountain biking, and camping at Lake Ashi.



Day 1 trip

Hakone Visitor Center



Gain in-depth knowledge of Hakone and its nature, as well as up-to-date information on hiking courses and activities at the Hakone Visitor Center.

Hiking / Trekking



Roam the natural wonderland of Hakone and discover the beauty of its four seasons, its volcanic terrain, views of Mt. Fuji and more. Become thoroughly acquainted with the area's volcanoes at the Hakone Geomuseum.



Camping



While admiring the beauty of Lake Ashi and its surroundings, enjoy a barbecue and other activities before laying your head down to rest for the night in a lodge or tent. Be sure to look skyward to delight in the twinkle of countless stars as you revel in the quiet passage of time.



Day 2 trip

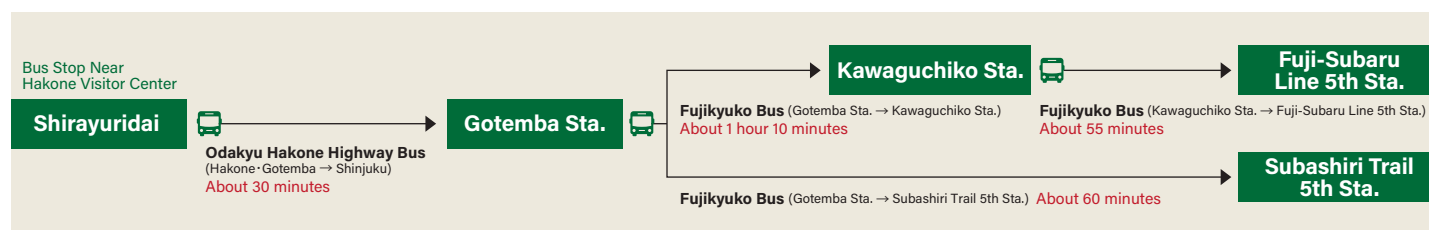
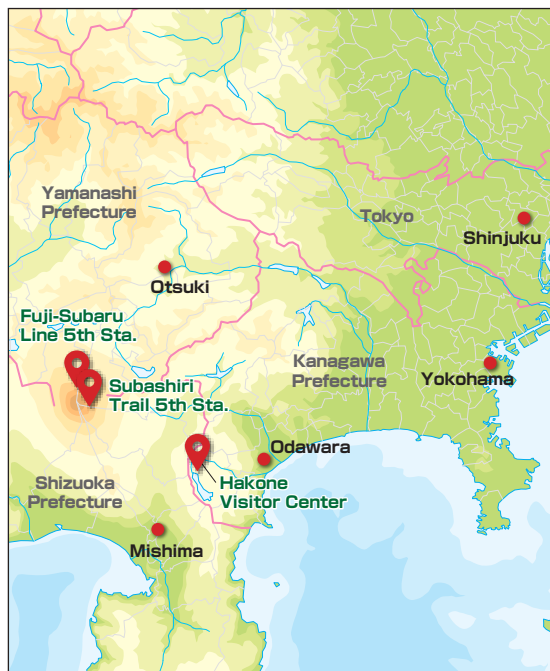
Mountain biking



Start your day at the Hakone Visitor Center and set off on mountain bikes to experience Hakone from a different perspective. A knowledgeable guide will lead you along a course brimming with charm centered on Hakone's Sengokuhara area.

Fuji-Hakone-Izu National Park (Northern Hakone Area)

The natural wonders of Fuji-Hakone-Izu National Park's Hakone area can be enjoyed in a multitude of ways. Particularly exhilarating is the area around the Hakone Visitor Center, from Kojiri to Sengokuhara (including Ōwakudani), where magnificent views of Mt. Fuji can be found, as well as abundant nature and incredible volcanic terrain. With adventure travel, you get face-to-face with the area's stunning natural beauty.

Discover the wonders of Fuji-Hakone-Izu National Park's natural environment at the Hakone Visitor Center. Learn about the area and acquire the latest information on the region's nature through topographical models, photos, high-definition videos, and more.

Opening Hours: 9am-5pm (Last Entry: 4:30pm)
Holidays: Second Wednesday and Thursday of June, New Year's holiday period

An excellent viewpoint from which to admire a vast panorama that includes Mt. Fuji, Suruga Bay, Sengokuhara, Lake Ashi and Mt. Komagatake. In fall, the waving tufts of a profusion of Japanese bamboo grass are a sight to behold!

On clear days, it's possible to see Mt. Fuji from the intersection of the Hakone Skyline Driveway and the Ashinoko Skyline Driveway. The mountain ridge of the trail descending Nagao Pass also boasts stunning scenery.

Course Plan:

- ① Hakone Visitor Center → Walk: about 35 minutes → Ubako Sta. → Hakone Ropeway: about 8 minutes → ② Owakudani Sta. → Walk: about 1 minutes → ③ Hakone Geomuseum
- ① Hakone Visitor Center → Walk: about 40 minutes → ④ Kojiri Pass → Walk: about 50 minutes → ⑤ Nagao Pass → Walk: about 1 hour and 30 minutes → ⑥ Sengokuhara
- ① Hakone Visitor Center → Mountain bike tour: about 3 hours 30 minutes → ⑥ Sengokuhara → ③ Hakone Geomuseum

Discover the Fuji-Hakone-Izu National Park's Hakone area by mountain bike on an outdoor cruising tour of the region. Enjoy magnificent scenery and the aromas and colors of nature that can't be experienced when traveling by car.

Business Hours: 8am-7pm
Holidays: Open year-round (irregular holidays)

In fall, the entirety of the Sengokuhara highlands becomes an undulating field of Japanese silver grass. The grass grows as far as the eye can see in the area between the road running from Daigatake Bus Stop to Sengoku-Kogen Bus Stop, and the slopes of Mt. Daigatake.

A botanical garden with a focus on vegetation that grows in damp-ground environments, including wetlands, rivers, lakes and marshes. Approximately 1,700 varieties of plants bloom across the seasons.

Opening Hours: 9am-5pm (Last Entry: 4:30pm)
Holidays: None during open season
Holiday Period: December 1st-March 19th (annual)

The only campground on the shore of Hakone's Lake Ashi. Choose from various types of accommodation, from villa-style cabins to motor-home camping and tent camping, and enjoy camping activities and barbecuing in the great outdoors.

Reception Hours: 9am-8pm

The crater of Mt. Kamiyama, Ōwakudani formed approximately 3,000 years ago during Mt. Hakone's last eruption. White smoke billows from the desolate expanse of land, where even now, visitors can experience the intense power of volcanic activity.

A valuable facility where visitors can learn of the origins and history of Hakone and Ōwakudani. Displays, including column exhibitions separated by theme, incorporate authentic items such as rocks.
