Roam the natural wonderland of Hakone and discover the beauty of its four seasons, its volcanic terrain, views of Mt. Fuji and more. Become thoroughly acquainted with the area's volcanoes at the Hakone Geomuseum.



While admiring the beauty of Lake Ashi and its surroundings, enjoy a barbecue and other activities before laying your head down to rest for the night in a lodge or tent. Be sure to look skyward to delight in the twinkle of countless stars as you revel in the quiet passage of time.





### 2 Day 2 trip



An excellent viewpoint from which to admire a vast panorama that includes Mt. Fuji, Suruga Bay, Sengoku-hara, Lake Ashi and Mt. Komagatake. In fall, the waving tufts of a profusion of Japanese bamboo grass are a sight to behold!



On clear days, it's possible to see Mt. Fuji from the intersection of the Hakone Skyline Driveway and the Ashinoko Skyline Driveway. The mountain ridge of the trail descending Nagaoka Pass also boasts stunning scenery.

## **Course Plan:**

- The diagram shows the mountain bike tour route starting at the **Hakone Visitor Center**. The route goes through the **Kojiri Pass** (marked with a green circle) and the **Nagao Pass** (marked with a blue circle). From the Nagao Pass, the route continues to the **Sengokuhara** station (marked with a red circle), which is connected to the **Owakudani Sta.** by a walkway. From Sengokuhara, the route continues to the **Hakone Geomuseum** (marked with a green circle). The total duration of the tour is approximately 3 hours and 30 minutes.
